

## **Another Disappointing CSA Teacher Offer**

On Wednesday 20 March 2024 we received another new offer from Christian Schools Australia (CSA) for the multi-enterprise agreement (MEA) for teachers. Regrettably, there has been no real improvement from their previous offer as outlined in our <u>last NewsExtra</u>.

## **Teachers pay**

The teacher pay increases proposed by CSA last week are:

February 2024 – 7% October 2024 – 4% October 2025 – 1.5% February 2026 – 1.5%.

In effect, CSA has brought forward 1.5% of the 3% increase previously proposed for February 2026, to October 2025. However, the CSA has *again* refused to give an assurance that rates will not be lower than equivalent NSW government school rates when they restructure the CSA teacher pay scale in July 2026 to match the number of steps on the government teacher pay scale.

In order to settle this dispute, our claims have been modest. We are seeking:

- increases of 2% in October 2025 and 2% in February 2026, not 1.5% in each year
- a commitment to at least match NSW government rates from July 2026
- an earlier MEA expiry date of 31 July 2026, not December 2026.

## What now for teachers?

We have written to CSA to reject their latest offer and to communicate our motion that was passed in our Council meeting on Saturday (view the letter here). We need further improvements in the offer from CSA.
